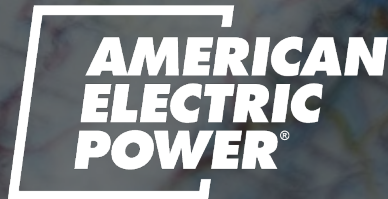

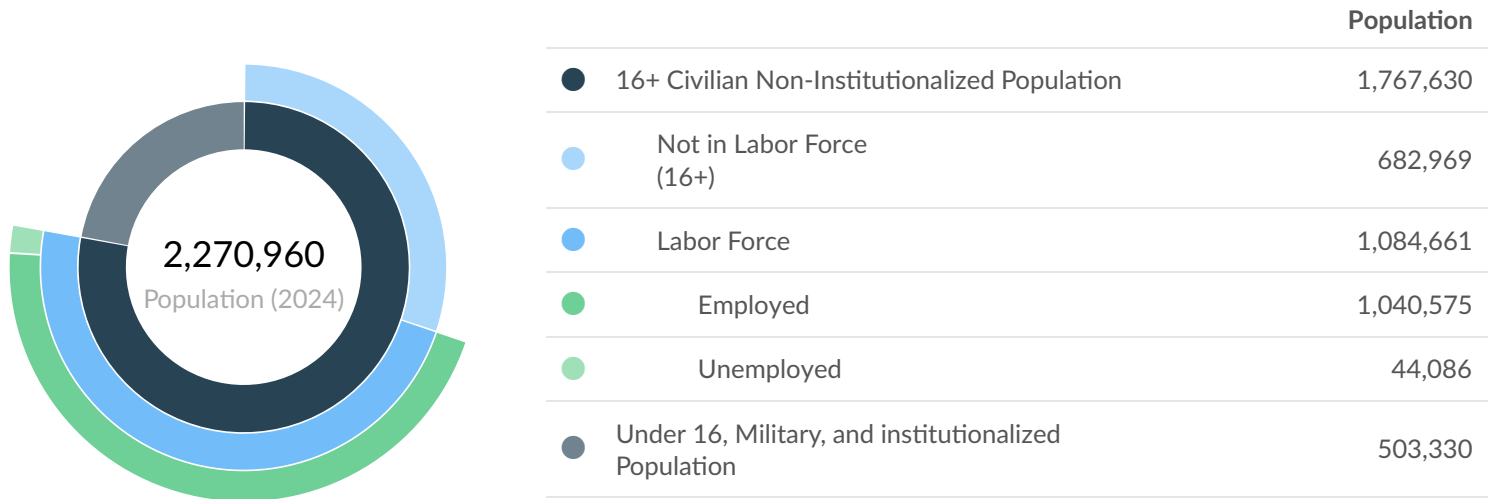
Regional average earnings per job are **\$17.0K below** the national average earnings of \$83.3K per job.

Takeaways

- As of 2023 the region's population **increased by 3.6%** since 2018, growing by 78,133. Population is expected to **increase by 3.2%** between 2023 and 2028, adding 72,888.
- From 2018 to 2023, jobs **increased by 1.3%** in Indiana Michigan Power-Served Indiana Counties from 1,080,312 to **1,094,693**. This change **fell short of the national growth rate of 4.3% by 3.0%**. As the number of jobs increased, the **labor force participation rate decreased from 64.4% to 62.1% between 2018 and 2023**.
- Concerning educational attainment, **19.5% of the selected regions' residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (1.6% below the national average), and **9.1% hold an Associate's Degree** (0.3% above the national average).
- The top three industries in 2023 are Restaurants and Other Eating Places, Education and Hospitals (Local Government), and General Medical and Surgical Hospitals.

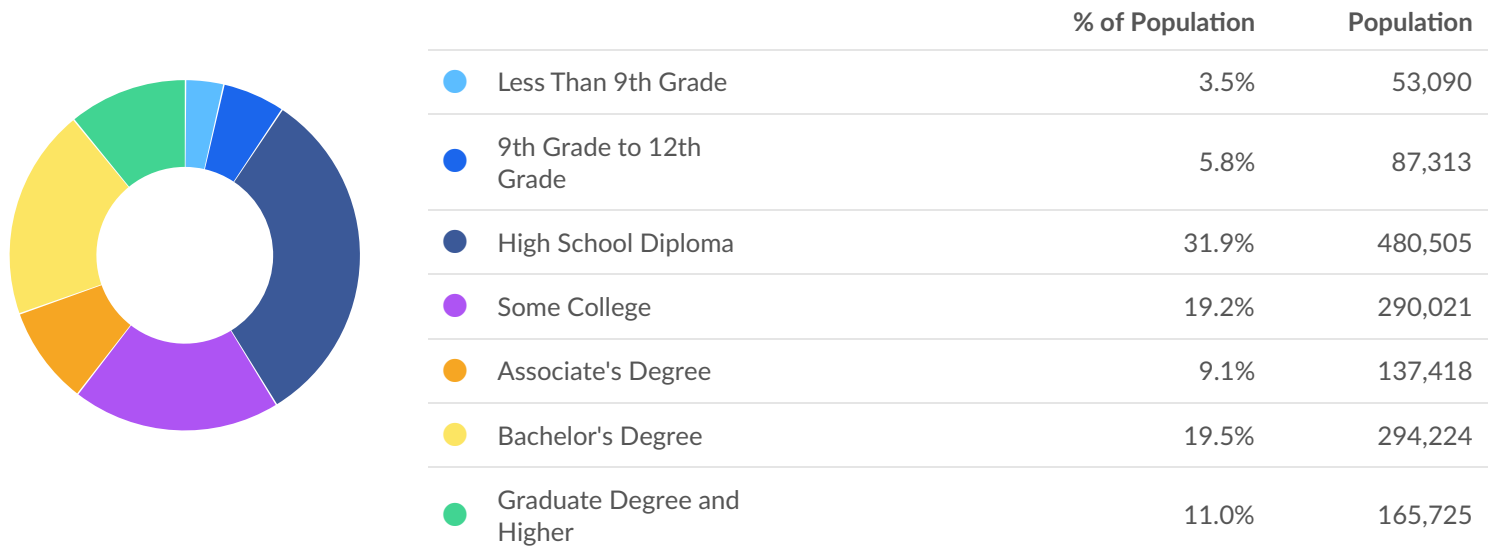

Mar 2024 Labor Force Breakdown



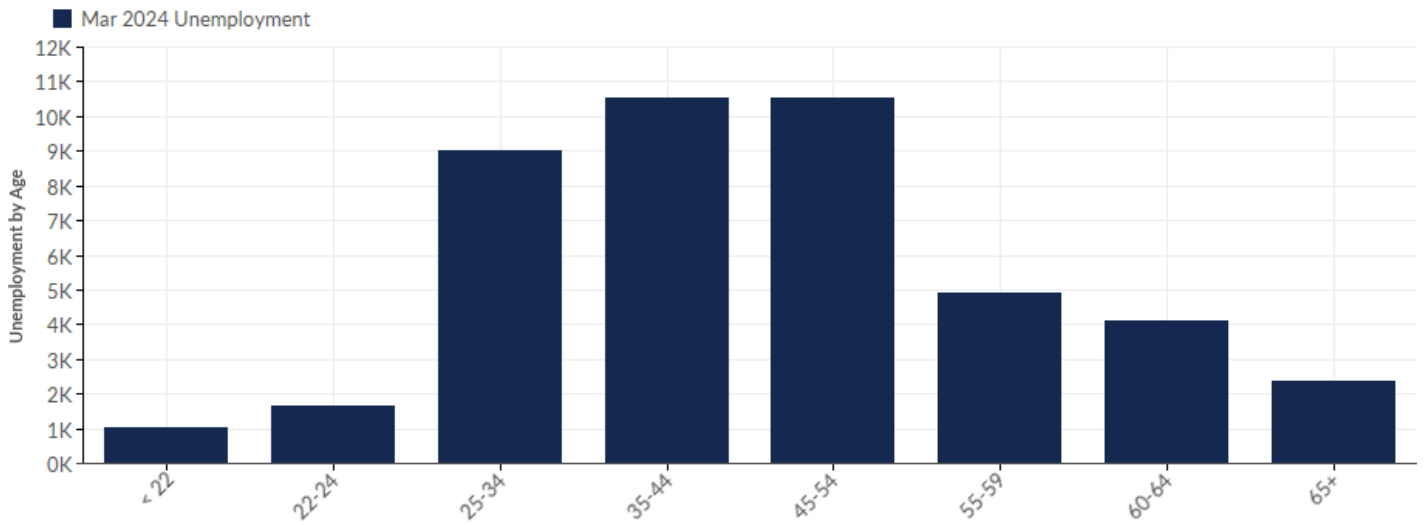
Educational Attainment

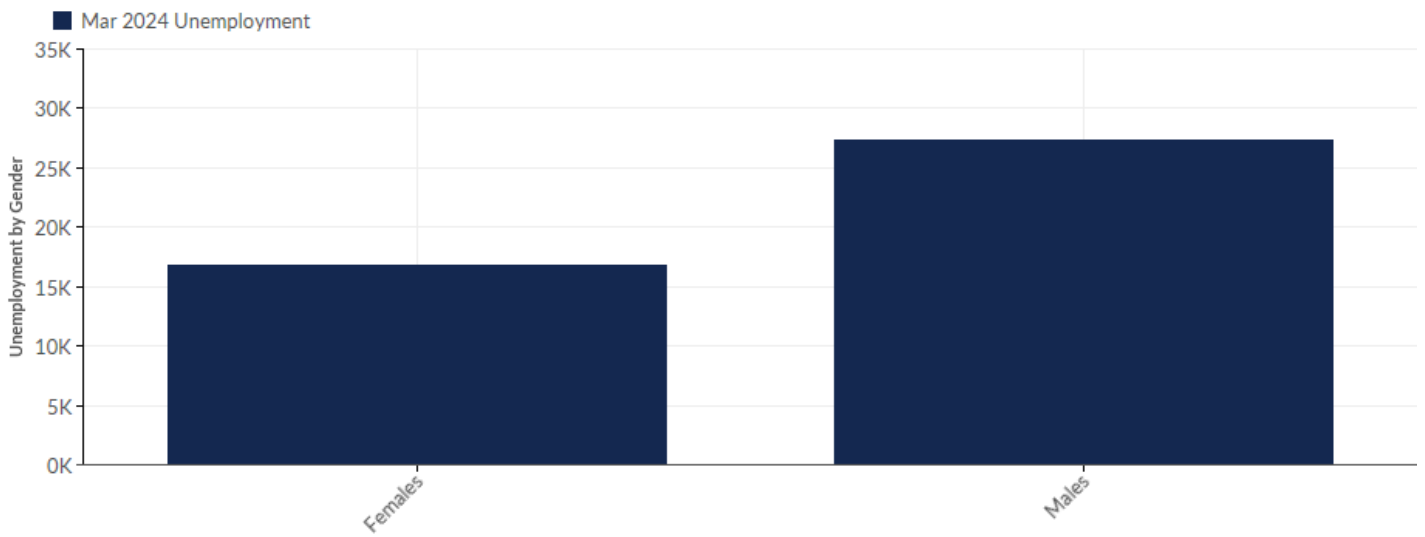
Unemployment by Demographics

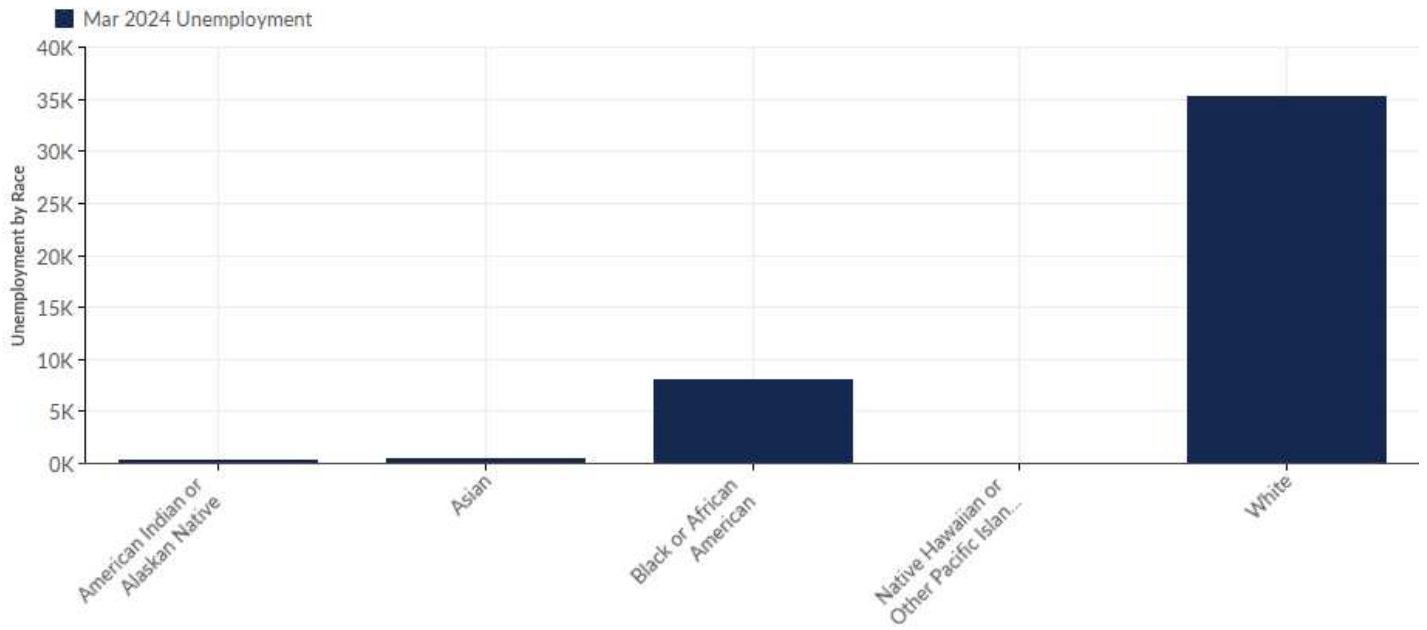

Unemployment by Gender



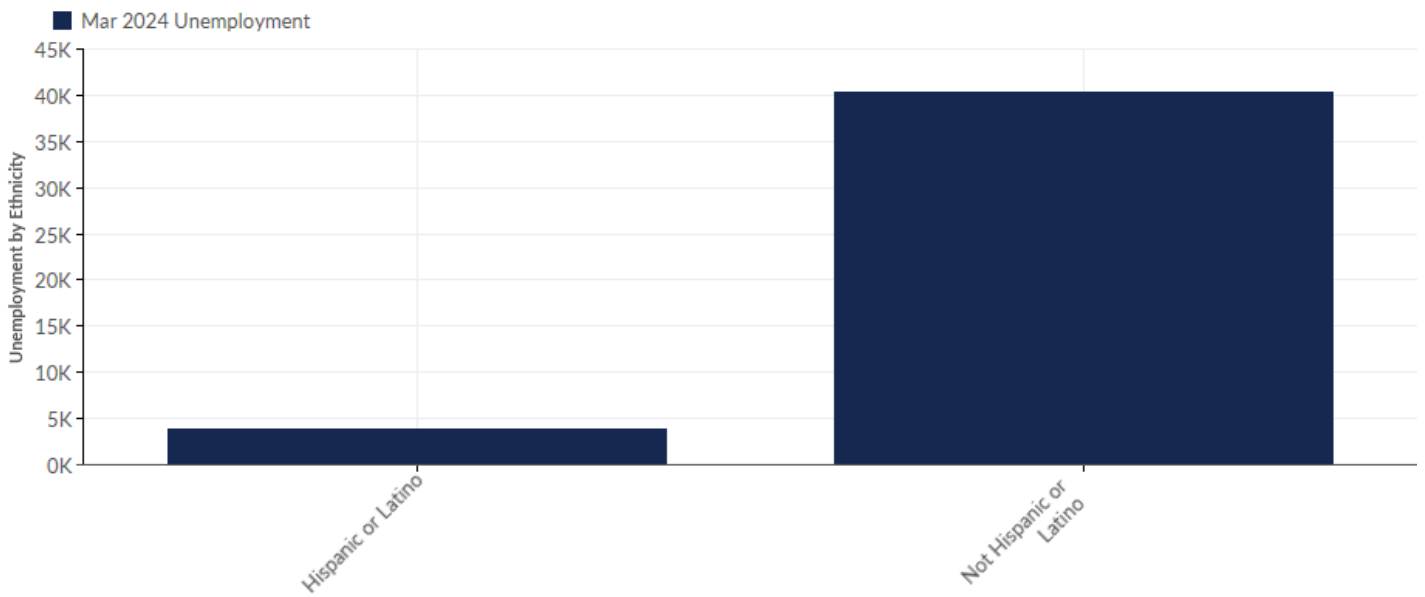

Unemployment by Ethnicity

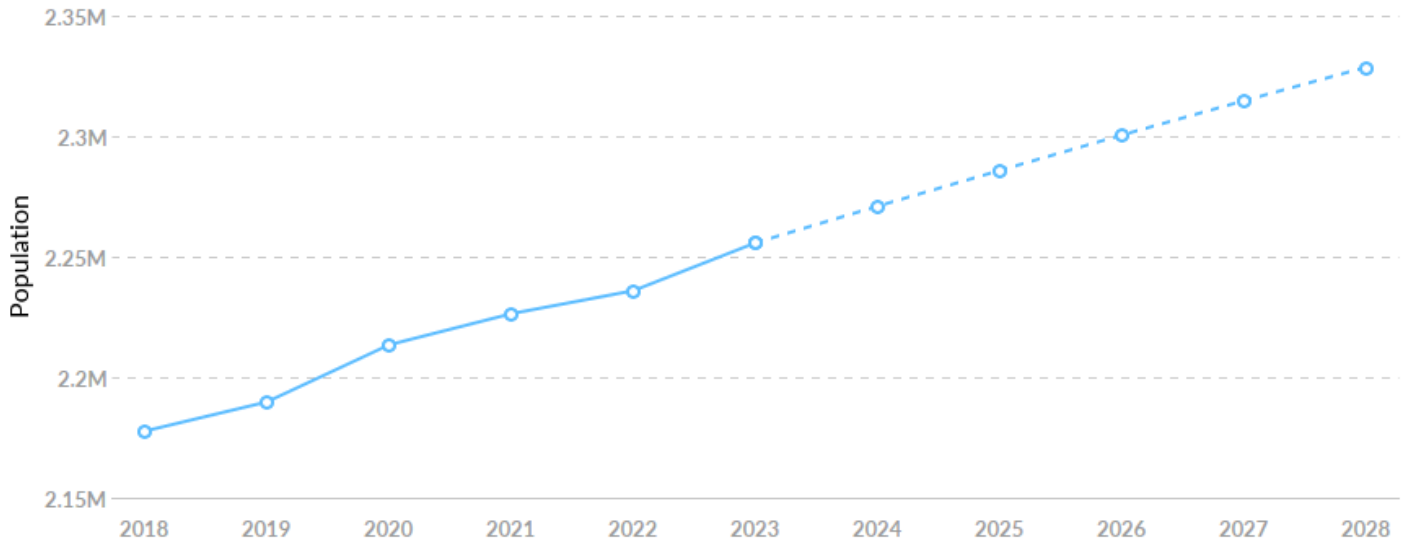

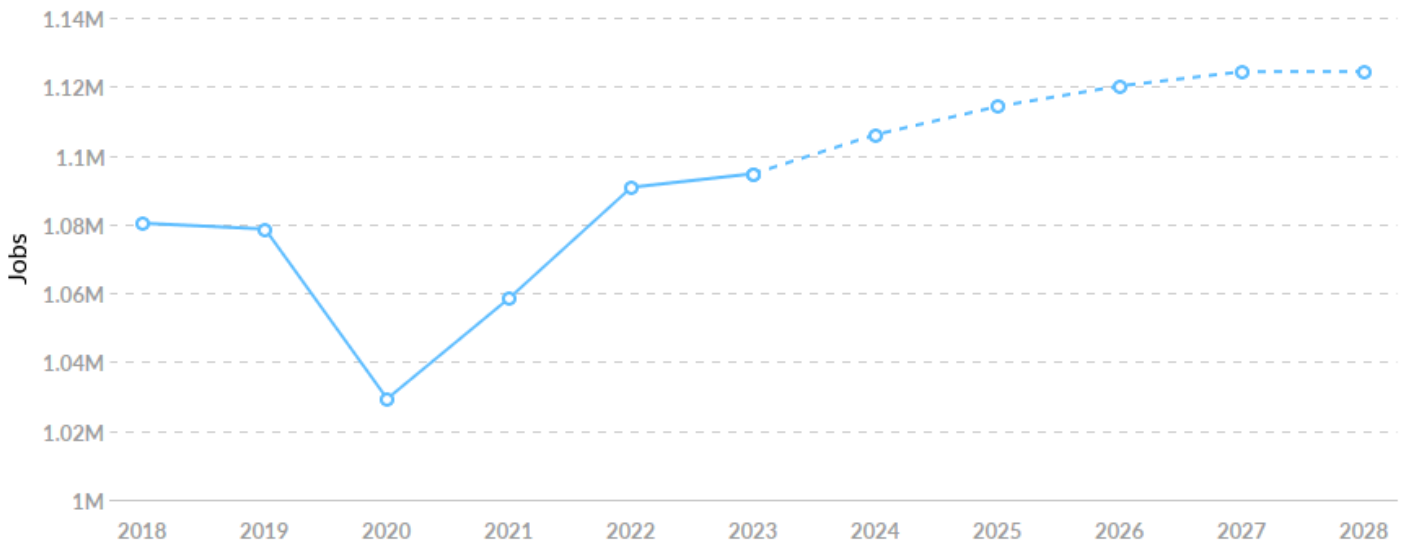

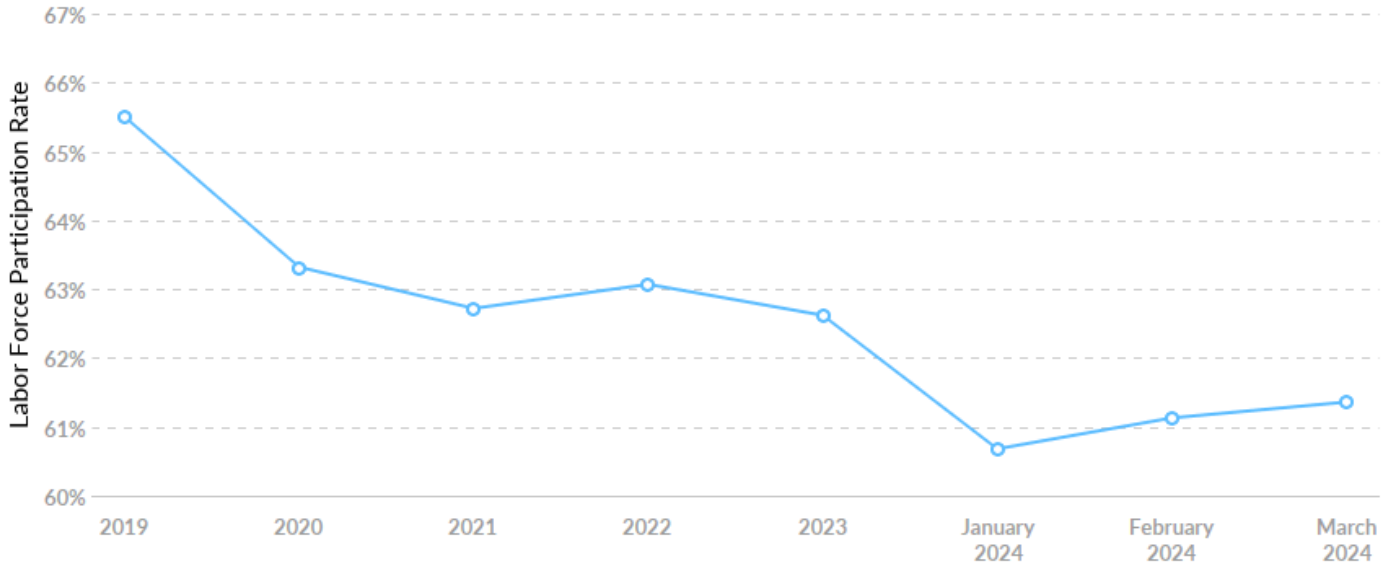
Job Trends

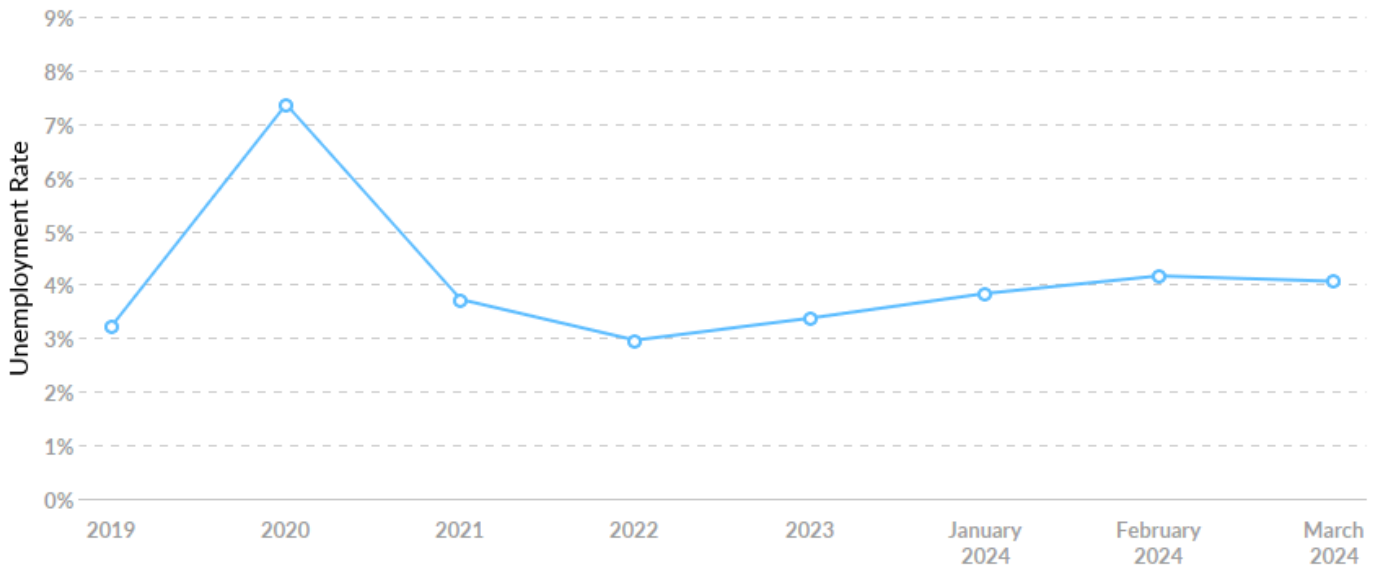

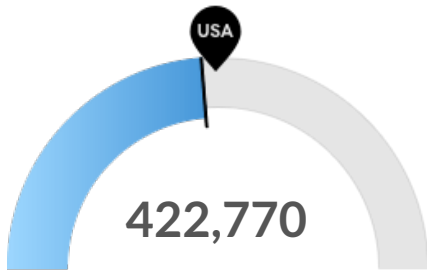

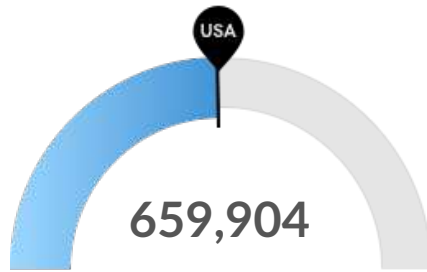

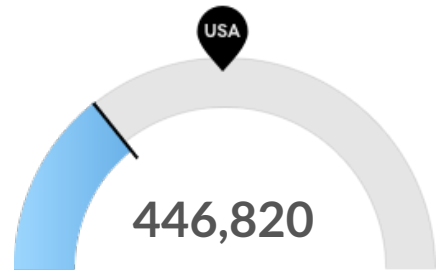
Millennials

Your area has 422,770 millennials (ages 25-39). The national average for an area this size is 454,636.



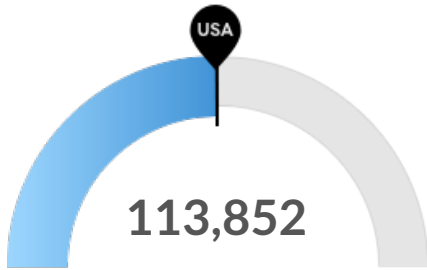
Retiring Soon

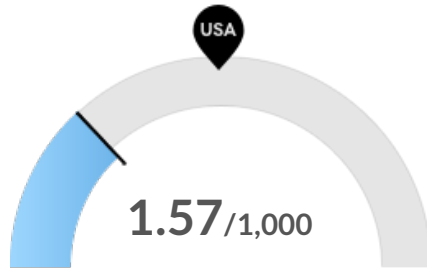
Racial Diversity

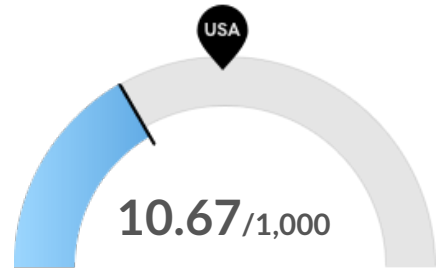

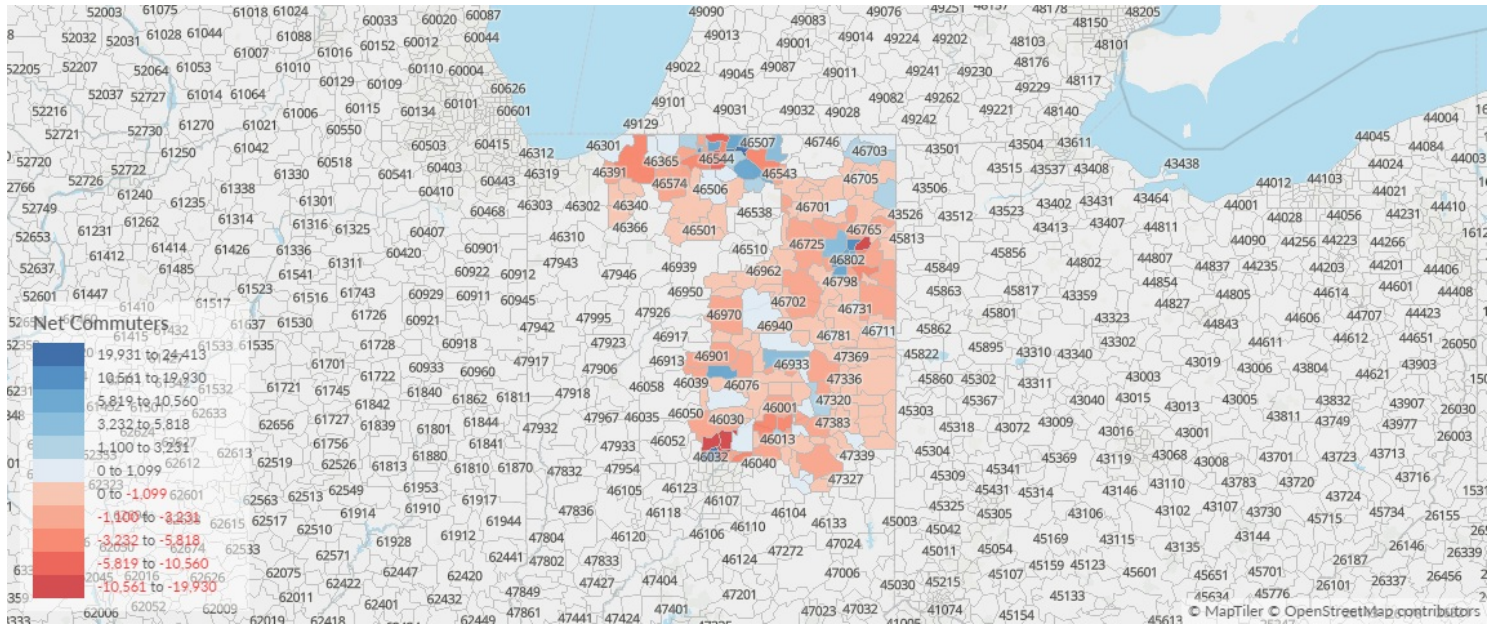

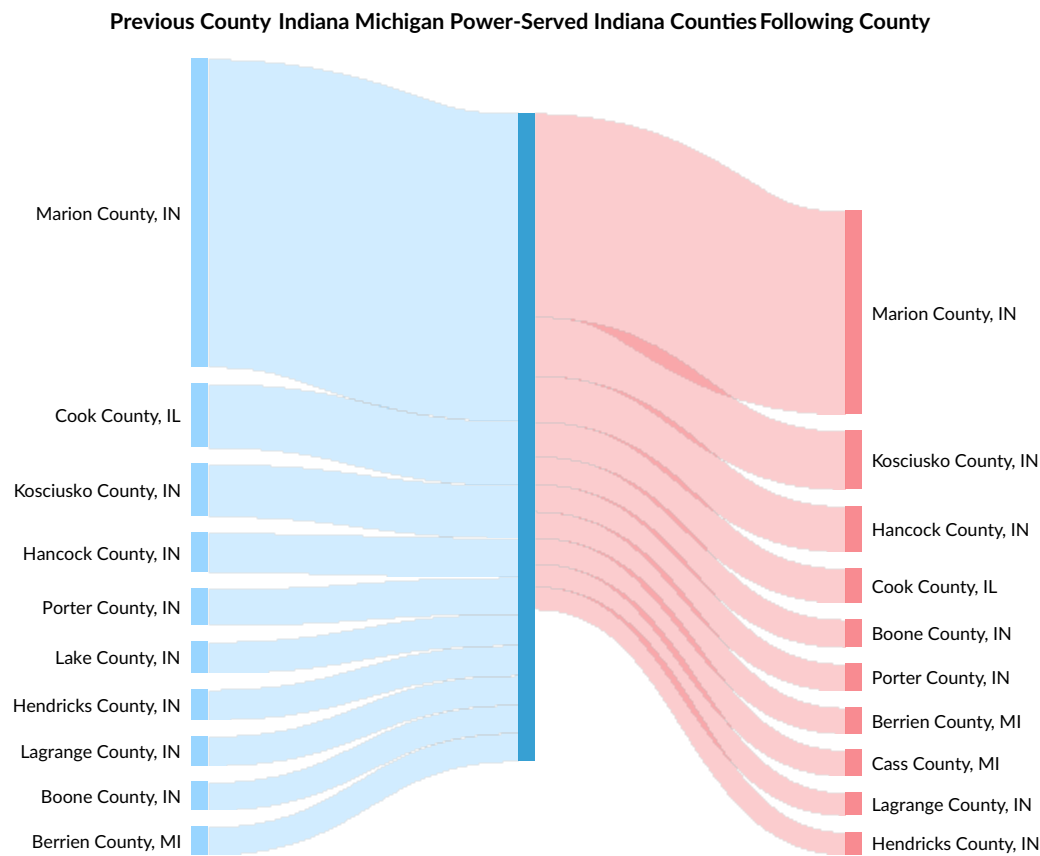

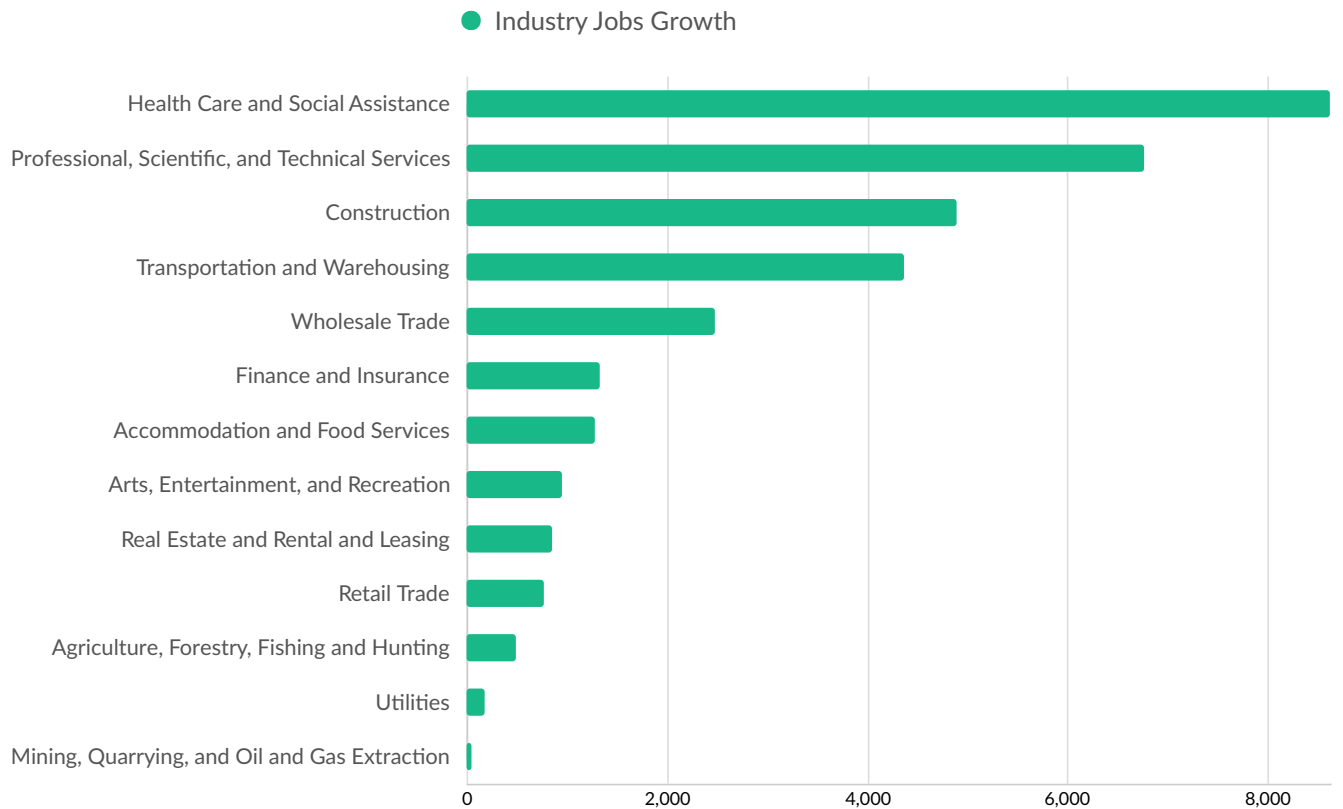

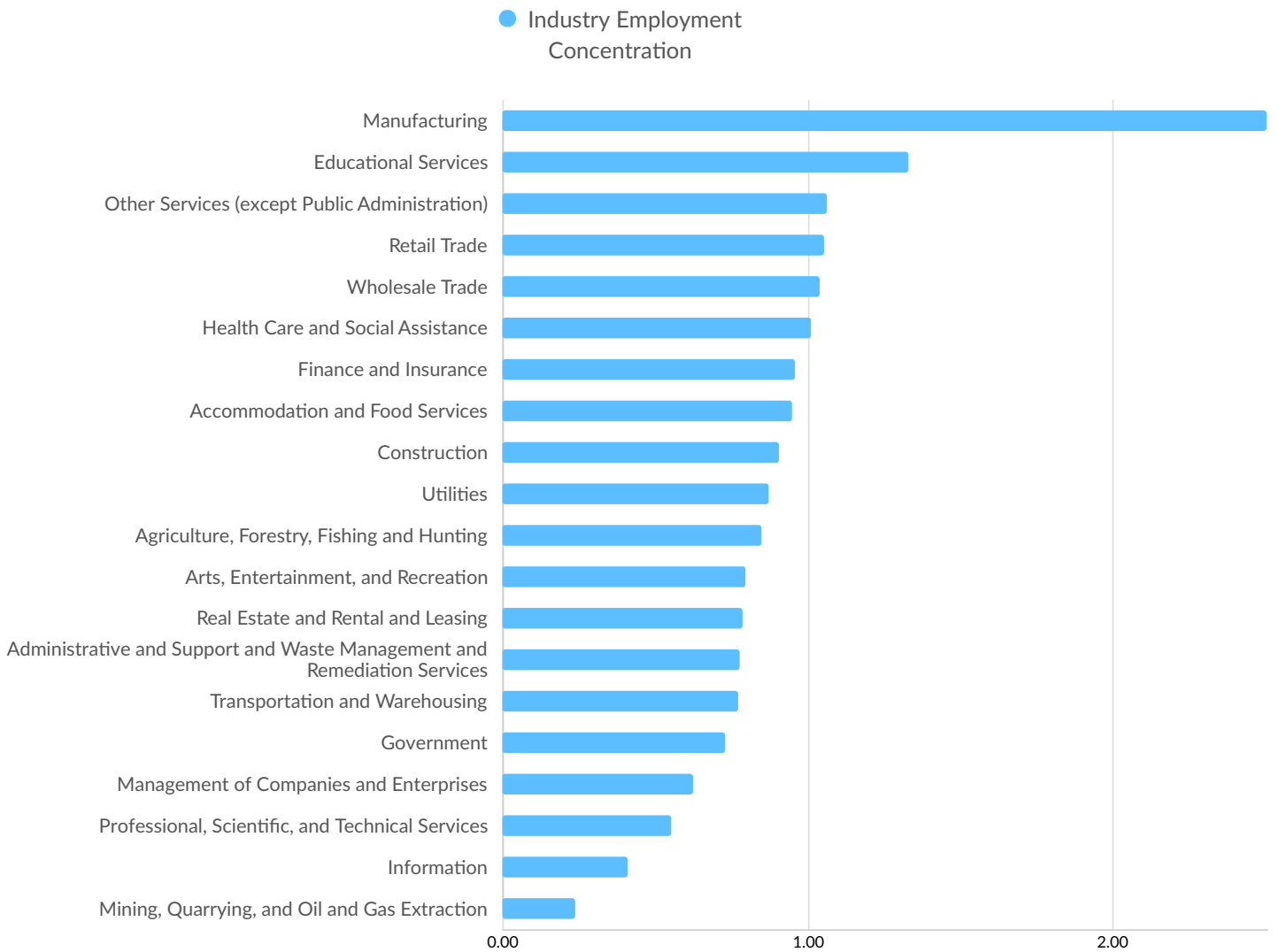

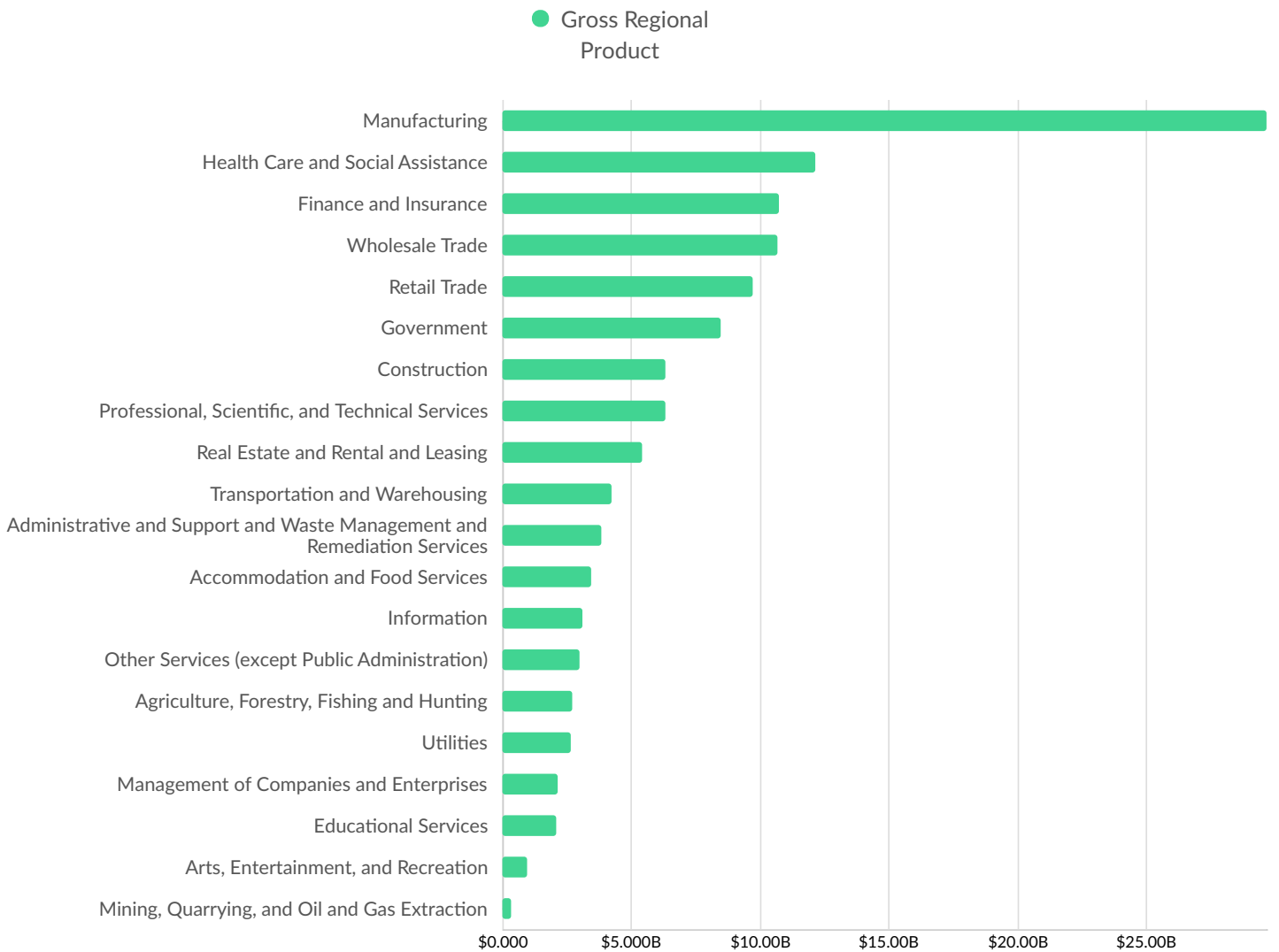
Top Growing Industries



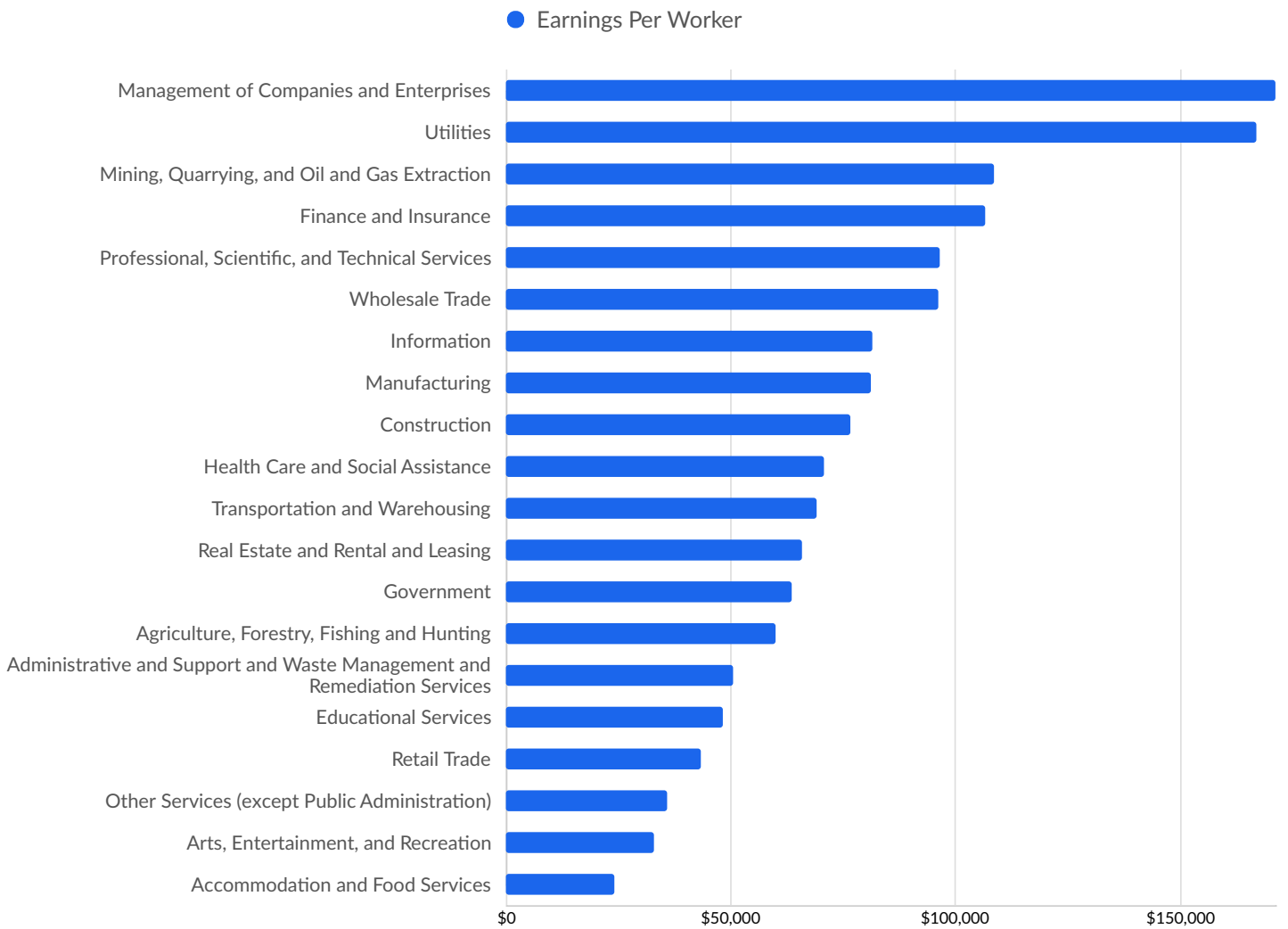
Top Industry Employment Concentration

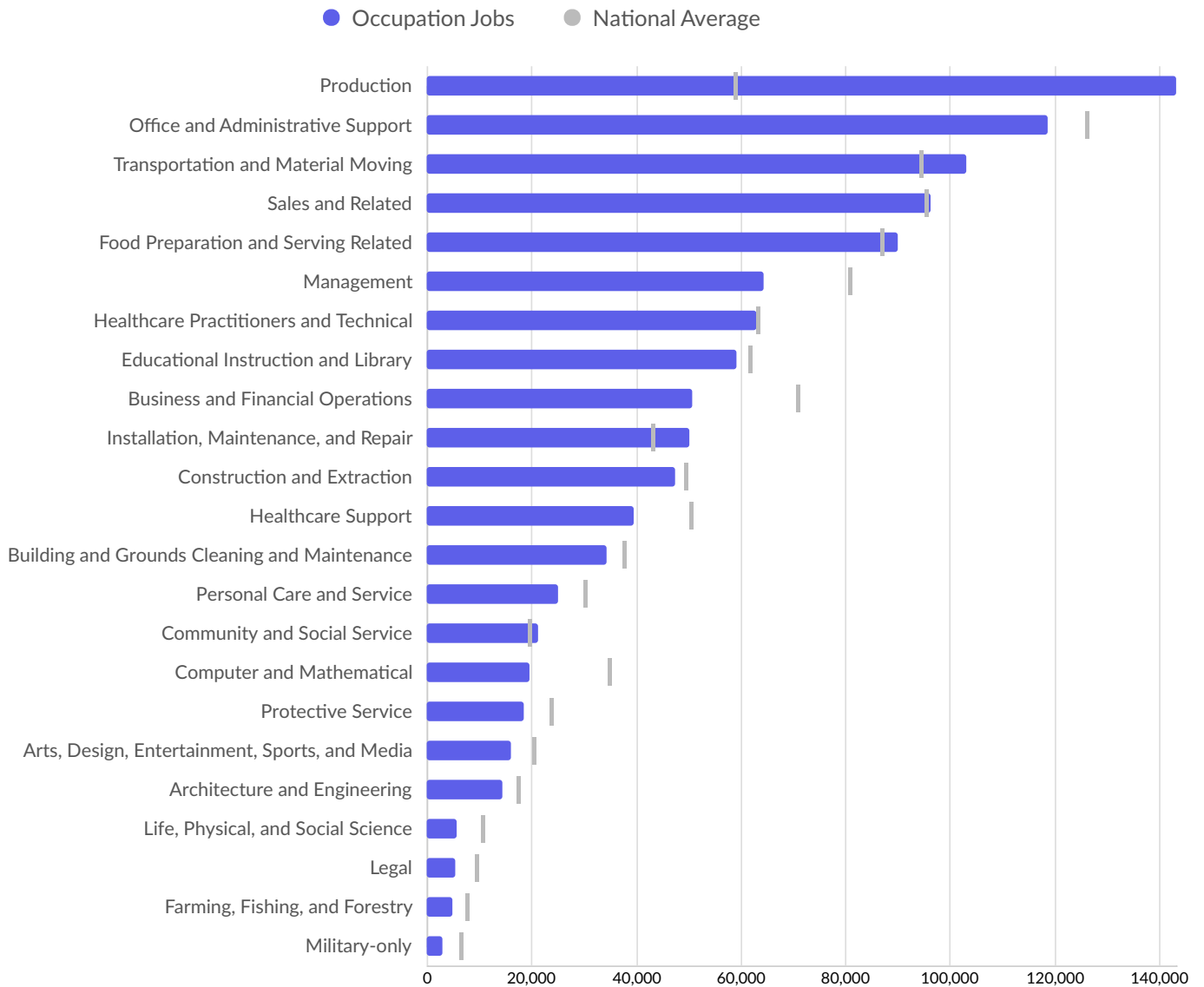

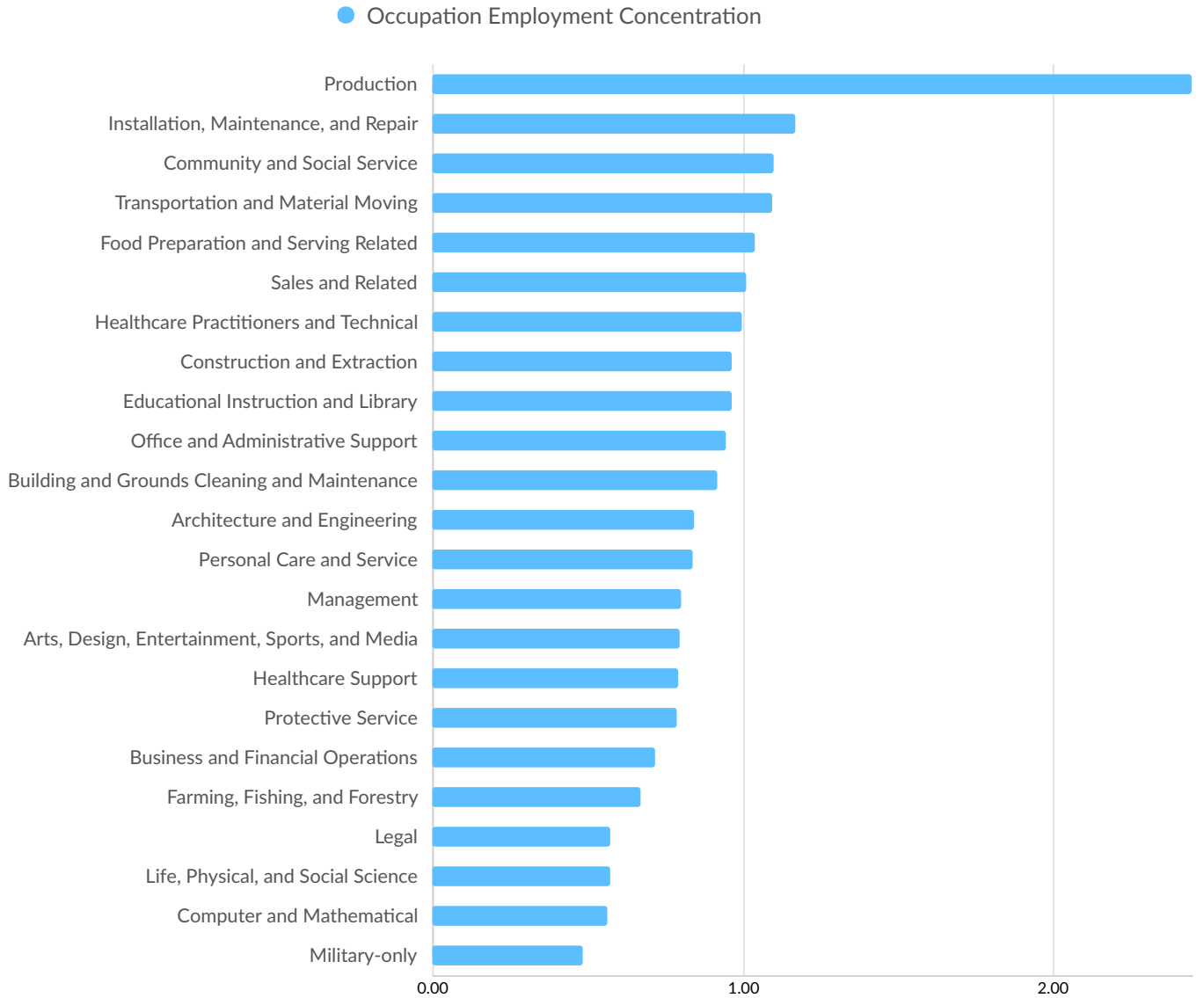

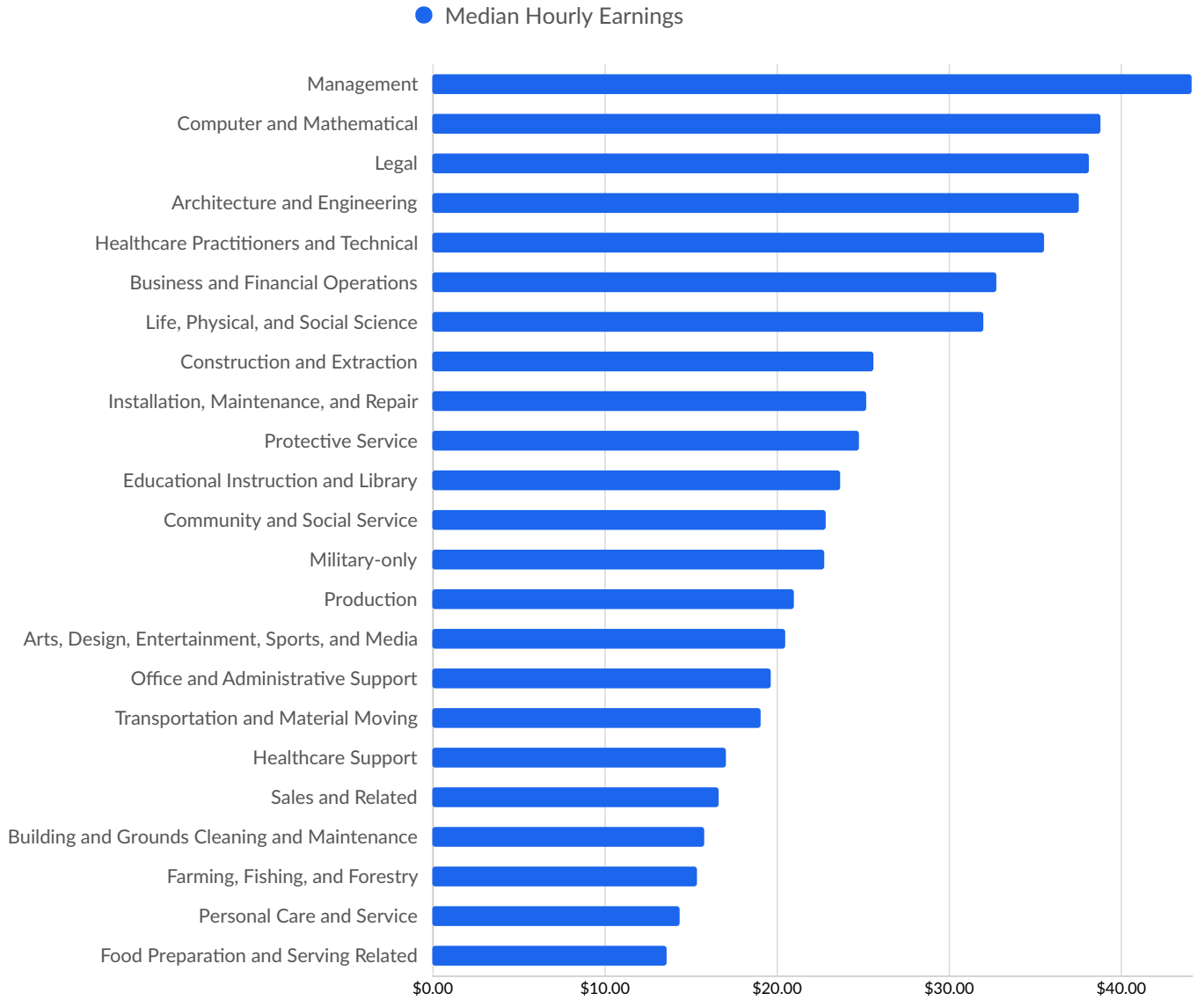
Top Growing Occupations



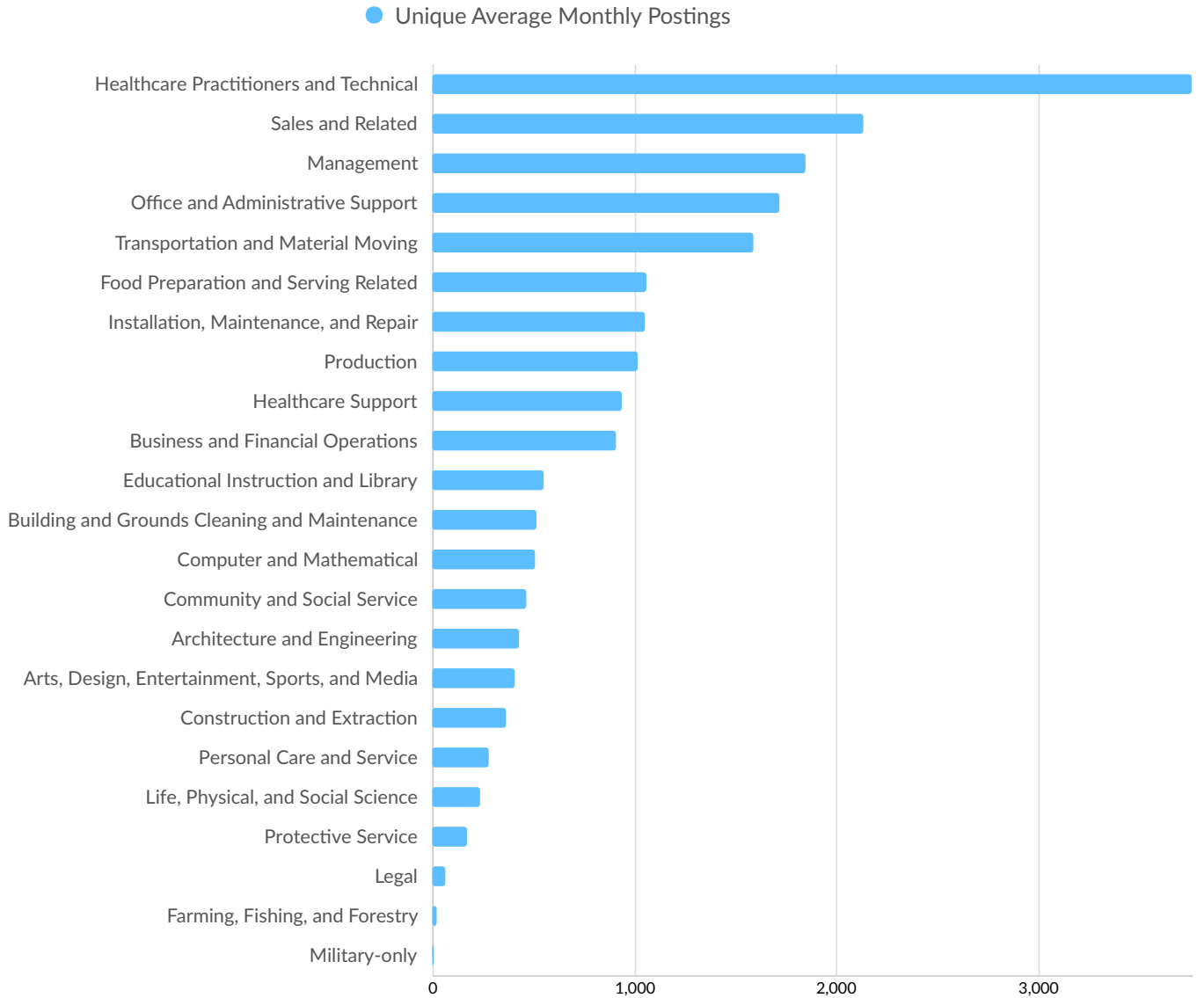
Top Occupation Employment Concentration



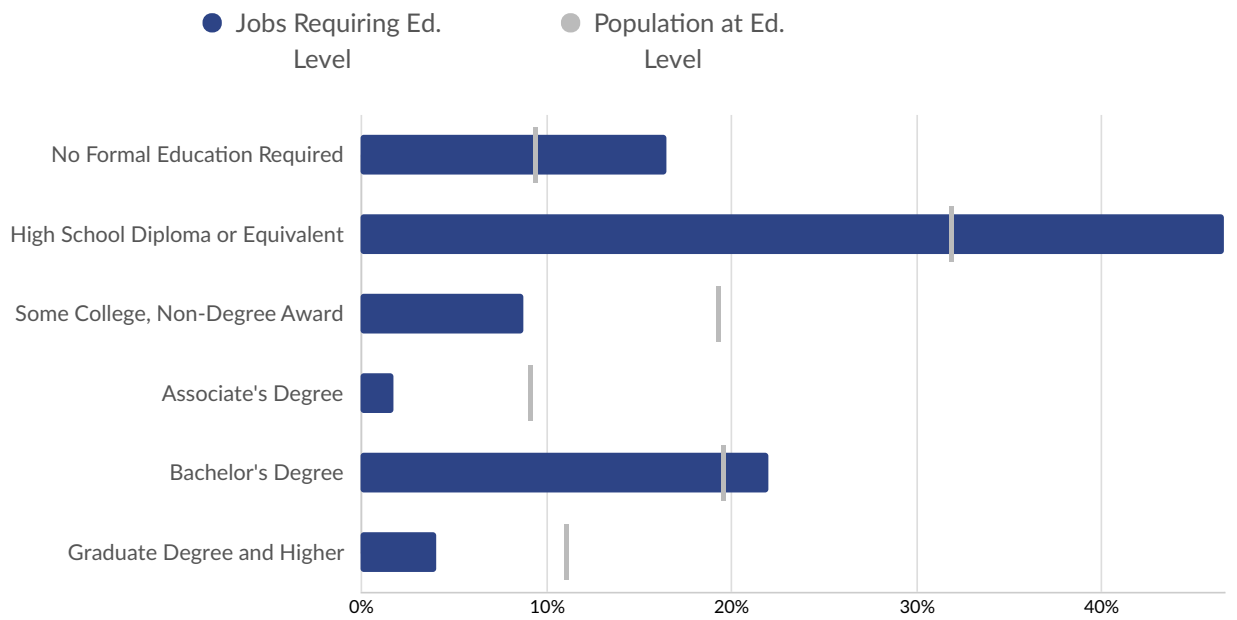
Top Occupation Earnings

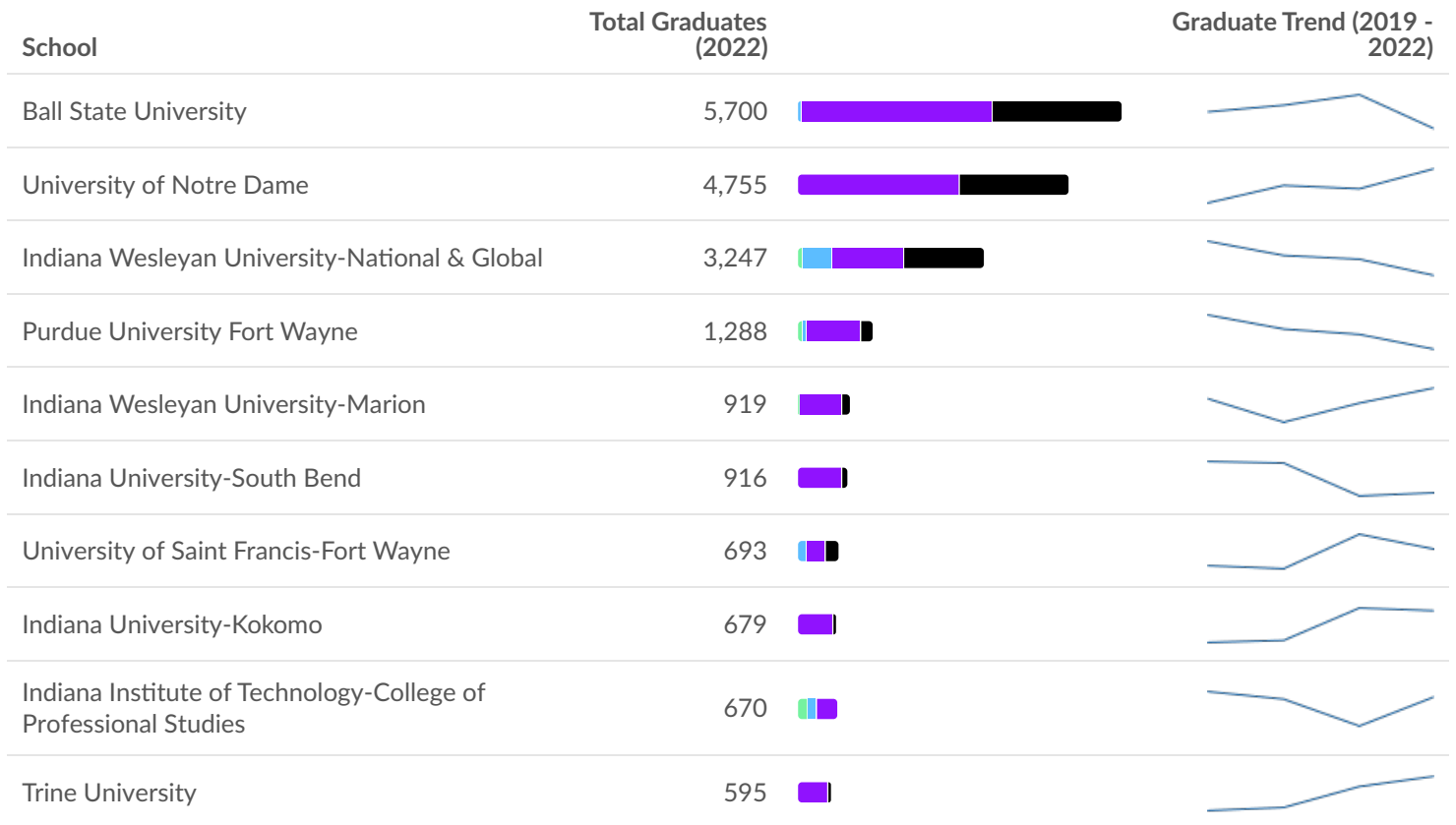

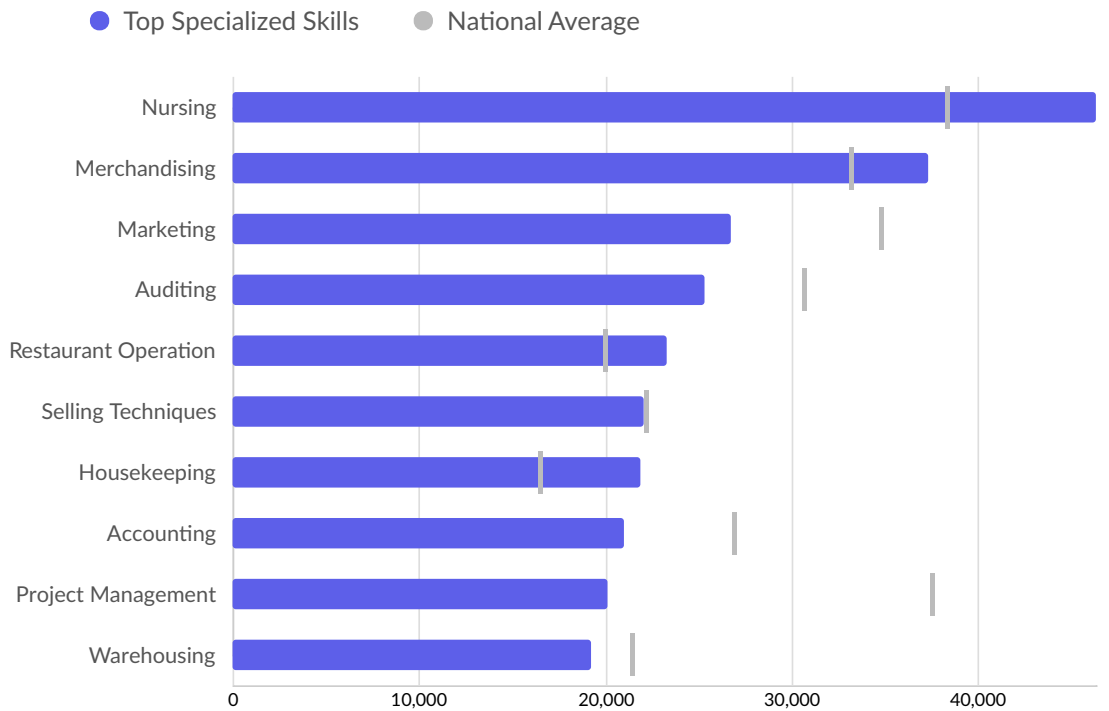
Educational Pipeline
